

# And Other Things Learned When My Daughter Came Out: A Journey of Love, Acceptance, and Growth

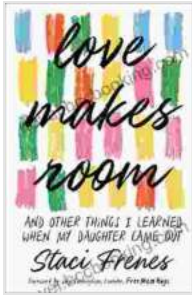

- **Be an ally:** Support your LGBTQ+ children and advocate for their rights and dignity.

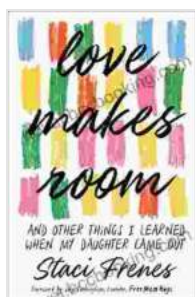
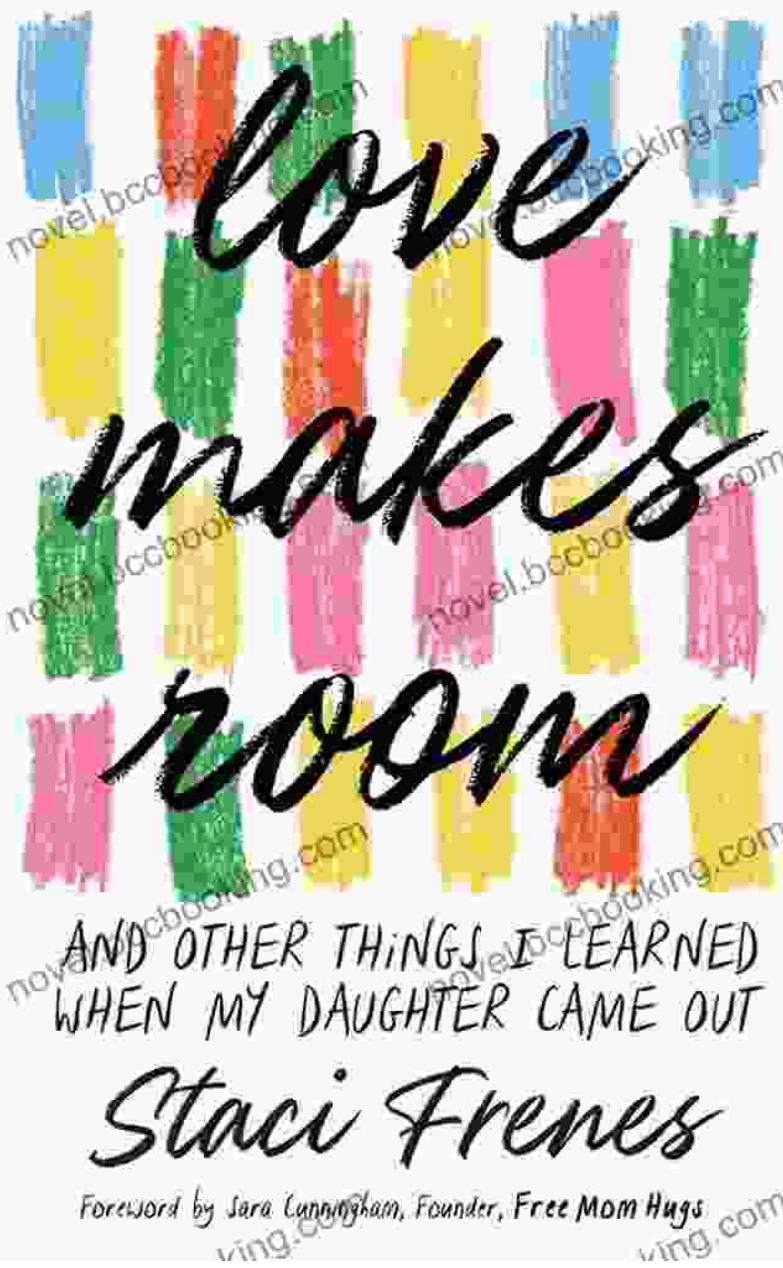
- **Embrace growth:** Never stop learning and growing as a parent. Allow your child's experiences to teach you about yourself and the world around you.

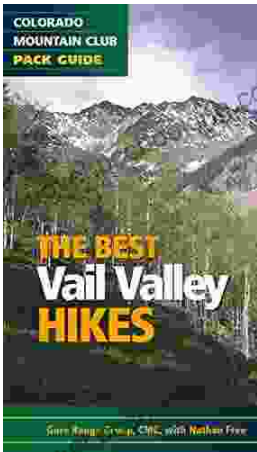


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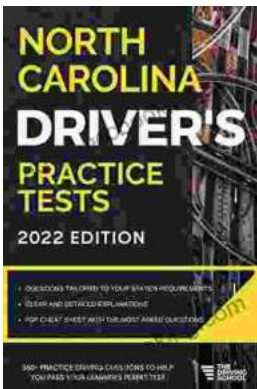
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
